SIXTH formers at Harrogate Grammar School saw one route to a greener future in the form of a student built hybrid race car on a trip to the Houses of Parliament.

The teenagers, studying Law and Politics, met Oxford Brookes motorsports students on a trip to London on Tuesday March 17.

They were shown a fuel efficient racing car, due to run in this year's Formula Student

competition where students put their engineering design and organisational skills to the test.

Harrogate and Knaresborough MP and Chairman of the House of Commons Innovation, Universities, Science and Skills Committee, Phil Willis, said: "It was a great opportunity for Harrogate Grammar School students visiting Parliament to meet some of the students from

one of the country's leading universities to look at some of the exciting project they're involved with.
